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

Our District's Vision




Relationships

Pre-School Program

Lambert's preschool program offers 2 full days of instruction each week. Classes meet on Mondays and Thursdays or Tuesdays and Fridays. The program is fully inclusive for general and special education students.

The program uses the Creative Curriculum and encompasses the whole child in daily learning at home and at school. Teachers work closely together to help students grow and get ready for school. The classes are able to work closely with each child and family while keeping learning fun with exciting STEM activities, reading, math, physical education, the arts, and learning about emotions and how to function in a classroom environment. This learning approach serves as the foundation for our preschoolers to move forward in success as they grow.

STEM Programs

Middle School students participate in Project Lead the Way classes, a program designed to give students a transformational learning experience based on STEM subjects.

5th Grade: Design and Modeling

Students discover the design process and develop an understanding of the influence of creativity and innovation in their lives. They are then challenged and empowered to use and apply what they've learned throughout the unit to design a therapeutic toy for a child who has cerebral palsy.

6th Grade: Engineering and the Environment

Students are challenged to think big and toward the future as they explore sustainable solutions to our energy needs and investigate the impact of energy on our lives and the world. They design and model alternative energy sources and evaluate options for reducing energy consumption.

7th Grade: Automation and Robotics

Students trace the history, development, and influence of automation and robotics as they learn about mechanical systems, energy transfer, machine automation, and computer control systems. Students use the VEX Robotics® platform to design, build, and program real-world objects such as traffic lights, toll booths, and robotic arms.

8th Grade: Flight and Space

The exciting world of aerospace comes alive through the Flight and Space (FS) unit. Students become engineers as they design, prototype, and test models to learn about the science of flight and what it takes to travel and live in space. They solve real-world aviation and space challenges and plan a mission to Mars.
