
The Marshall Islands



Lack of Belonging

- Aspirations and post-secondary plans
- Bullying
- Large class sizes
- Lack of role models
- Generation gap between youth and parents



Understanding of Norms

- Differences from Marshallese school system
- Public health messaging during pandemic



Communication

- School materials aren't translated
- Shared phone
- Familiarity with Facebook and Facebook Messenger
- Home visits effective, but resource intensive
